> Barry revealed that several plant improvements aimed at increasing operating cost efficiency are currently underway and that increased marketing efforts in a highly profitable area of the dairy business will be launched in the near future.

Lehigh Valley is both a manufacturing and marketing cooperative, distributing a full line of dairy products in five states. The Cooperative represents 600 farmers and in 1975 processed over 390 million pounds of milk.

Sales in fiscal 1976 should reach the \$100 million mark, Barry said.

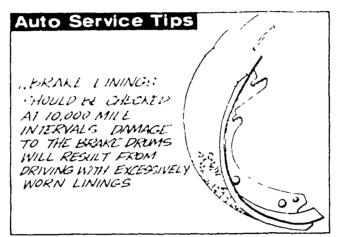

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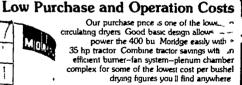
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
