

# E-Town Fair exhibits grow by 300 per cent

ELIZABETHTOWN The Elizabethtown Community Festival was a surprise to several people involved. Mrs. Sara Myer, chairperson of the Market Place Fair reported that the amount of exhibits in the Market Place tent grew by nearly 300 per cent.

"I'm really proud of the exhibits this year," she said as she pointed out the well organized, lovely display of flowers, vegetables, canned goods, and other horticultural exhibits.

The amount of outside stands also grew from previous years. And, this year, there was a totally new added extra - an FFA tent. In that tent were two goats, two sheep, a mare and a colt, a sow and her litter, two steers, and a heifer.

"We hope to have state funding in two years," Mrs. Myers said. If they pass the state test this year, they will have only one more year of state tests to go and funding will be available. If the funding does go through, the Jaycees have hopes of possibly buying land and getting some permanent buildings. At present, they rent the land from the Elizabethtown College.

Bill Shuker, president of the Jaycees, also noted that the organization would really like to make the Fair a community event.

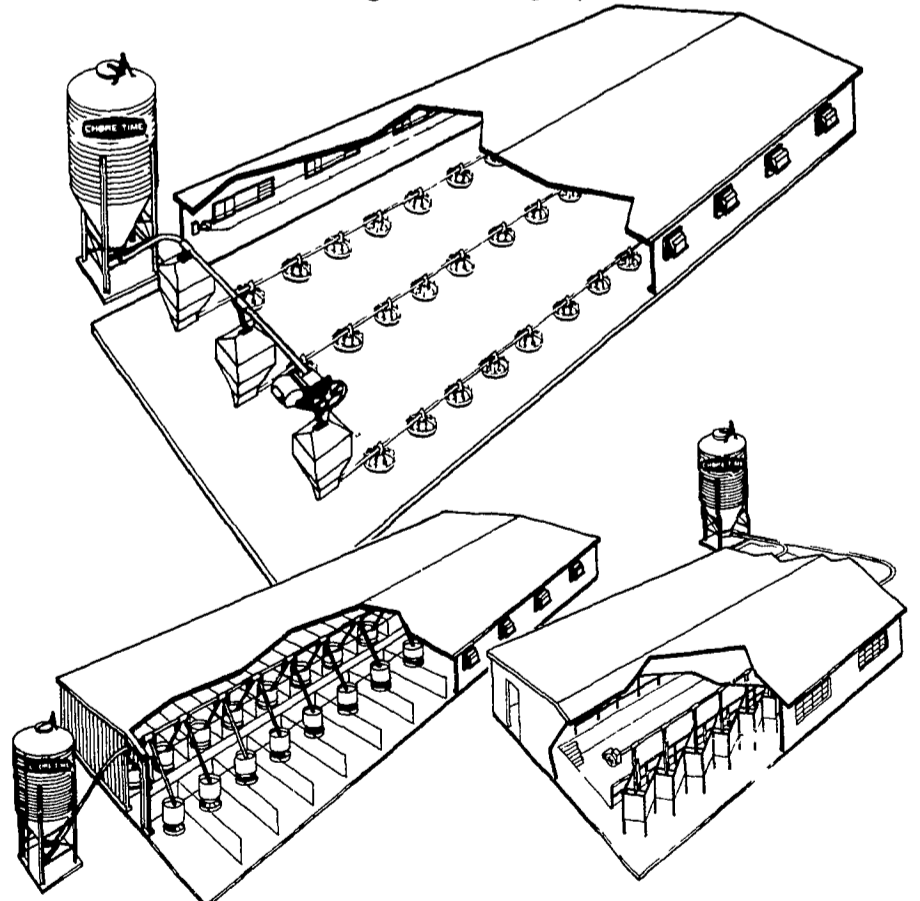
