### Dairy figures compared

Twenty-five years ago the average dairyman shipping milk to Inter-State Milk Producers Cooperative, Philadelphia, produced 344 pounds per day, compared to 1700 pounds today. Last year the average dairyman shipping to Inter-State grossed \$65,000 on milk sales, compared to \$8717 a quarter of a century ago. Milk prices, which are now well over \$10 per hundredweight, stood at \$5.34 in 1951.

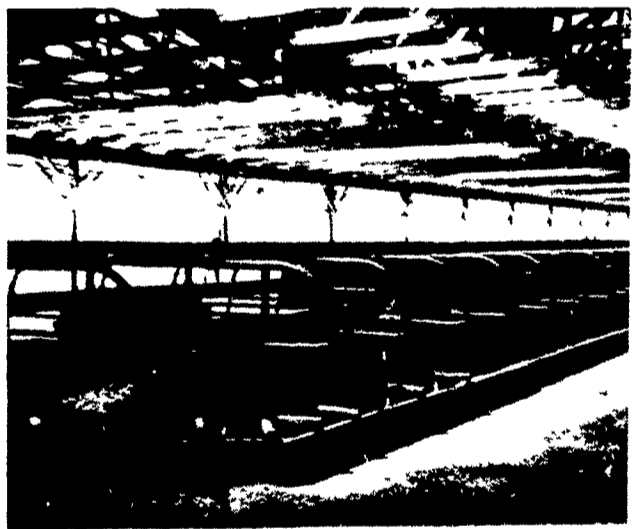

Cut bedding costs 75 per cent, reduce labor for barn cleaning and cow washing, reduce teat and udder injury to the minimum — house your milking herd in free stall housing. Our free stall partition may be mounted on wooden head boards or we make a steel divider. Set the legs in 8 to 10" concrete curbs to hold and retain bedding. Stall floor can be soil, sand or gravel. Bedding — straw, sawdust, peanut hulls, ground corn cobs, etc. Should be installed with paved alley surface 8 feet wide for mechanical cleaning or washing.

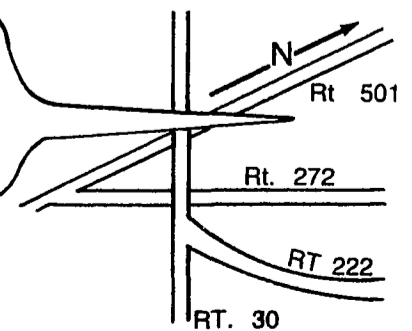
