

## Rail judges scored

HARRISBURG - Dairy cattle were not the only animals being judged during the week-long Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show held this week at the Farm Show Building in Harrisburg. "Railbird judging" also shared the spotlight.

You may wonder what is a railbird judge? They exist in all spectator sports but are known by different names. In football, they're the Monday morning quar-

terbacks and in baseball they are grandstand managers.

Although dairy show managers select only the top internationally-acclaimed judges, there are always breeders and herdsman who think they are better. This is, at best, an immodest attitude, as the judges for this year's All-American came from New York, Wisconsin, Ohio, Indiana, Virginia, Massachusetts and Iowa. Every day, during the

judging in the main arena, judges selected four of the top cows in a class. Interested railbirds then had an opportunity to place these animals in their proper order. Railbird judges cards were collected and graded, with the first, second and third place railbird judges receiving trophies. This does not necessarily prove that railbirds are better than the judges, but the winners found new respect for the judges. The losers, of course, screamed "We was robbed!"

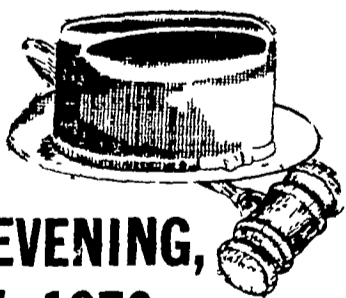
