Millions Celebrate 4-H Week

UNIVERSITY PARK, PA - More than five million
young people across the country will celebrate National 4-
H Week on Oct. 3-9. In special observances keyed to the
theme, "4-H - Room To Grow," they'll be taking a close
look at opportunities for growth in 4-H.

4-H'ers have a proud heritage. The 4-H movement
began around the turn of the century and grew out of a
need to make education more practical and interesting to
farm youth. The first 4-H projects, corn clubs for boys and
canning clubs for girls - offered enriching, real-life
learning experiences not provided by rural schools of the
era.

Projects have changed through the years as the faces of
4-H'ers have changed. But the basic "learn by doing"

concept still holds and has wide appeal. Today 4-H
members take part in activities that range from animal
care to environmental improvement to photography and
bicycle care and safety. Although 4-H continues to serve
the needs of rural youth, it has also grown in the more
populated areas. 37 per cent of 4-H members live in cities,
towns, and suburbs. And 4-H'ers come from all racial,
ethnic, and socio-economic backgrounds.

About 120,000 Pennsylvania 4-H members are joining
this week's observance which includes over 3,000 from
Lancaster County. These young people are directing their
energies and talents toward building a better tomorrow.

Each member is involved in one or more projects for
which he or she alone is responsible. Although members
receive counsel and guidance from parents, volunteer
adult leaders, and Extension staff members, the value of
the finished projects is up to the individual. The "learn by
doing" concept carried out in dozens of project areas
illustrates the 4-H way of preparing youth for tomorrow.

Good citizenship is one of 4-H's goals. A member learns
to be a good citizen by being one. Members have a chance,
through 4-H citizenship projects, to contribute to America
before they are voting age.

National 4-H Week is a good time to check into the op-
portunities the 4-H program can offer. The Extension
Service is your local 4-H information center.
