The interest rates for six month financing terms, effective immediately, will be seven per cent for U.S. bank obligations and eight per cent for foreign bank obligations. For one-year financing terms, the interest

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The rate will be 7-1/2 per cent for U.S. bank obligations, and 8½ per cent for foreign bank obligations.

The interest rates under existing financing approvals will not be changed.

The CCC Export Credit Sales Program is a commercial program under which credit is extended for periods from six months to three years to expand export markets.






