

County FFA judging results from fairs released

MANHEIM, Pa. - Judging results from county FFA competition at the Manheim and Lampeter Farm Shows were recently made public. These Fall competitions are considered the first step in the process of going to state competition and then onto the national level.

In the ninth grade livestock judging contest held at the Manheim Farm Show the following were the results.

Livestock


