

National Grange to publish song book for the deaf

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The National Grange has announced the publication of "Lift Up Your Hands," a book is a collection of patriotic and inspirational songs illustrated in sign language with music for the guitar.

The women's activities department of the Grange adopted a national health project several years ago to aid the deaf and hard of hearing. Mrs. Jenny Grobusky, director of women's activities, said that in working with organizations and individuals serving the deaf she discovered a book of this nature was not available. She said, "During the past few years Grange youth have also become very much involved in teaching sign language and their interest

in helping the deaf has taken on new dimensions."

Consequently the women's department and youth department joined forces to publish "Lift Up Your Hands." The book is being edited by Donna Gading, Tom Skinner Associates, Office of Campus Ministries, Gallaudet College and Dr. Lottie Riekehof, coordinator of Interpreter Training, Gallaudet College, Washington, D.C. Gallaudet College is the only college for the deaf in the country. William Steel, National

Grange youth director, said the book will be unveiled during the annual session of the National Grange, Nov. 8-15 in Atlantic City, N.J. Copies will then be available for purchase at a cost of \$2.00 from National Grange Headquarters, 1616 H St. NW, Washington, D.C. 20006.
