4-H Beef and Lamb Club holds roundup and sale

THOMASVILLE, Pa. - York-Adams County 4-H Beef and Lamb members held their annual roundup and sale October 26 and 27 at the Thomasville Livestock Market.
Laurie Dobrosky, Glen Rock, R2, showed the grand champion lamb. The animal was a 135-pound Shropshire-Suffolk crossbreed. The

animal sold for \$1.21 a pound and was purchased by J. L. Miller Meats, York, R8. Miss Dobrosky also exhibited the animal which won the reserve grand champion lamb title. The purebred Dorset weighed in at 95 pounds. Ray Mummert, Brodbeck, R1, finished the bidding for the reserve animal at \$1.07 a pound.
A total of 47 lambs were exhibited by the 27 par-

ticipating 4-H'ers. The sale animals, not including the grand and reserve winners, brought a total of \$2,594.65 for their York and Adams County sellers. Placing the sheep during the show was Dr. Erskin Cash, Penn State University.
"H.P.C.," a 1,180 pound purebred Angus, owned by Christine Shive, Seven Valleys, R1, won the Grand Champion Steer banner. He

sold to Jay's Supermarkets of York for 80 cents a pound. Tim Caldwell, Windsor, R1 exhibited the Reserve Champion steer. Another of the Angus breed, the reserve animal weighed 1,140 pounds and went to Thomas's Meats, Shrewsbury, for 67 cents a pound. The two steers also were named grand and reserve champions of the Angus breed show.
In the Hereford division,

Stephanie Lehr, Spring Grove, R2, exhibited the winning steer. Reserve Hereford placing went to Katy Kohr, Wrightsville, R1.
In addition to the steer competition, the 4-H members participated in fitting and showing classes with their animals. Champion fitter was Tim Caldwell who also won the Junior competition; and reserve fitter was Christine Shive.

Medium age winning fitter went to Ed Klinedinst, age 13, and first place senior fitter went to Jeff Golden of Gettysburg.
Champion showman was Ed Klinedinst. Tim Caldwell took another award in the category, being named reserve showman, as well as winner of the Junior division Senior class winner was [Continued on Page 93]
