*\$22,000 bagged at feeder sale

HARRISBURG - The 1976 Keystone International Livestock Exposition was host to a feeder calf show and sale. After competition in the morning, the calves were auctioned off in the evening. The sale netted \$22,236.15, for 93 calves.

The top price paid for a calf was \$1.36 per pound. Don States, Indiana County, bought the 560 pound Angus steer calf for \$761.60 to use as a 4-H project. The Angus was part of the grand champion pen of the morning show, exhibited by Irvington Farms, Gaithersburg, Md.

Runnymede Farm, Coatesville, Chester County, showed the champion pen of five feeder heifers. Buck and Doe Run Valley Farms Co., also from Coatesville earned the reserve champion laurels for a pen of feeder heifers.

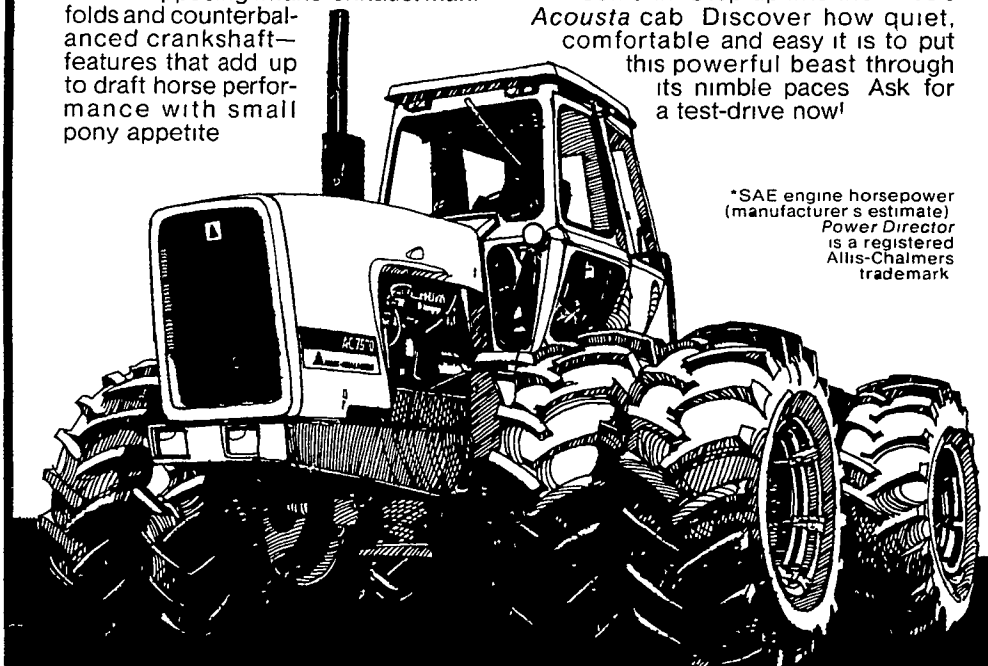
