Top beef at 4-H show and sale brings \$1.40/lb.

ALLENTOWN, Pa. - Schuylkill competed in the Forty-six steers from the 36th Eastern Pennsylvania 4-H Beef and Lamb Show and Sale held at the Allentown

Fairgrounds, on November 20. The champion beef of that show was exhibited by Blair Hower, Northampton County. The animal weighed 1088 pounds, and sold for \$1.40 per pound to George's Foodliner, Westgate Shopping Center, Bethlehem. The total was \$1523.20.

Gwen Hower, Nor-

thampton County showed the reserve grand champion steer weighing 1098 pounds which was sold for \$1.01 per pound for a total of \$1108.98. The buyer was Haftl Meats, 948 N. Front St., Allentown, Pa.

George's Foodliner purchased the champion light weight steer weighing 1028 pounds for 63 cents per

pound. This steer was exhibited by Sarah Fretz, Lehigh County.

The champion heavy weight was purchased by Ontelaunee Lions Club, New Tripoli, Pa. The beef was exhibited by Diane Krause, Lehigh County, and weighed 1193 pounds. It sold for 72 cents per pound.

The reserve champion light weight steer weighing 1015 pounds sold for 54 cents per pound and was bought by George's Foodliner. This steer was exhibited by Dale Guest, Northampton County.

Carol Krause, Lehigh County, showed the reserve champion heavy weight steer weighing 1291 pound. The animal was purchased by Schoeneck International, Schnecksville, for 60 cents per pound.

The grand champion individual lamb, weighing 107 pounds was sold at \$1.75 per pound to George's Foodliner. It was owned by Sarah Fretz, Lehigh County.

The grand champion pen of lambs, exhibited by Gail Snyder, Lehigh County, was purchased by George's Foodliner. The pen of lambs weighed 275 pounds and was sold at \$1.35 per pound.

Haftl Meats, purchased the reserve grand champion lamb for 95 cents per pound. This lamb was exhibited by Beth Ann Nehoda, Bucks

County. It weighed 105 pounds. The Reserve Grand Champion Pen of Lambs shown by Sarah Fretz, Lehigh County weighed 229 pounds and was purchased by George's Foodliner for 96 cents per pound.

The total weight of the 46 steers in the sale was 50,523 pounds and the total sale was \$25,728.46.

The lambs weighed a total of 3386 pounds and grossed \$2,921.30.

The average price per pound of the steers with the grand champion included was \$50.92. Without the champions the average was 78.66 cents per pound. Last year's averages were 84.20 and 83.20 cents, respectively.
