Wheat bought, corn cancelled

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Department of Agriculture announced that the Soviet Union has purchased 300,000 metric tons (11 million bushels) of U.S. Hard Red Winter wheat for shipment in the 1977-78 wheat marketing year (June-May; and at the same time cancelled an earlier purchase of 400,000 metric tons (16 million bushels) of U.S. corn that was to have been shipped in the 1976-77 corn marketing year (Oct.-Sept.).

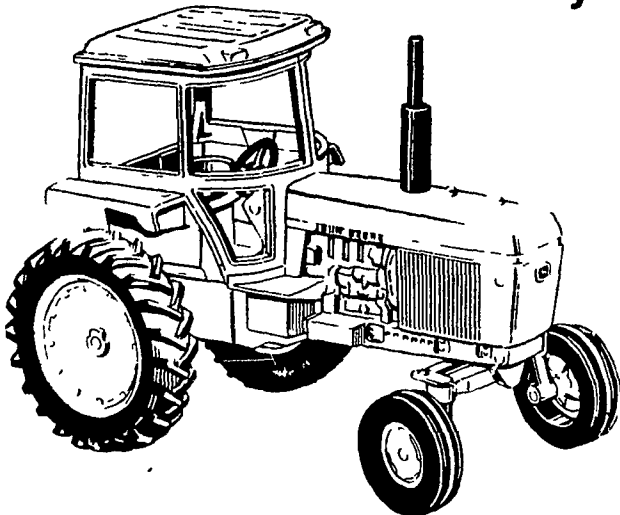
The sale-cancellation was reported by a private export firm under the Department's

export sales reporting requirement which requires sales of 100,000 tons or more be reported to the Department within 24 hours of completion.

As a result of the corn sale cancellation, export sales of grain and soybeans to the Soviet Union for shipment out of the 1976 crops now stand at 7.8 million metric tons, including 3.55 million

tons of corn (140 million bushels), 2.9 million tons of wheat (106 million bushels) and 1.35 million tons of soybeans (50 million bushels). In addition to the sales for 1976-77 shipment, 480,000 metric tons (17.6 million bushels) of U.S. wheat has been sold to the Soviet Union for shipment in the 1977-78 wheat marketing year beginning next June.
