Winter wheat acreage bucks trend

HARRISBURG, Pa. - Winter wheat sown in Pennsylvania for harvest in 1977 is estimated at 300,0000 acres according to the Crop Reporting Service. Based on the condition of the crop December 1, the 1977 wheat production is forecast at 8.1 million bushels or four per cent below 1976. Rye planted this fall is estimated at 65,000

acres which is equal to a year earlier.

Winter wheat sown in the U.S. for harvest in 1977. totaled 55.8 million acres, three per cent less than last year. This halts the trend of steadily increasing acreage that prevailed over the past six years. Production of the 1977 winter wheat crop, based on December 1 con-

ditions, is forecast at 1,438 million bushels, eight per cent below the 1976 crop. Rye growers seeded 2.9 million acres, one per cent less than last year and the smallest acreage on record.




