Estimated Daily Livestock Slaughter Under Federal Inspection

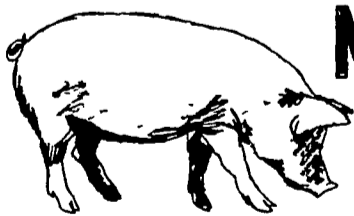
