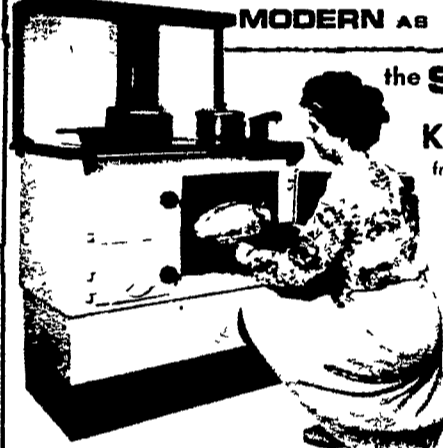

Menhennett, Cochranville R1, who took the reserve champion ewe of the show.

The four person Shober-

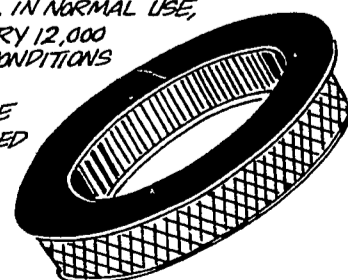
