Kaylor's steer brings \$7744

HARRISBURG - The "Farm Show Weather" returned for the closing of the 61st annual Pennsylvania State Farm Show as the grand champion steer went on the auction block, selling

for \$6.05 a pound, or a total of \$7,744.

The steer, "Archie," exhibited by Janice Kaylor, 15, of Elizabethtown, Dauphin County, was a 1280pound Angus-Chianina crossbred It was sold to Mr and Mrs. Ray Coffey, owners of the Black Angus Inn, Route 100, Ludwigs Corner, Chester County. This is a first for the Coffey's, who broke the domination of the junior steer sale of Robert Myers. Myers had bought champion steer, the price moved up very slowly, and stalled at \$2 50 a pound, well below the final price. Agriculture Secretary-Kent designate D. Shelhamer then stepped into the ring to lead the steer to its final price.

At \$6.05 a pound, the steer sold for under the record price of \$6.40, set at last year's Farm Show. Miss Kaylor, a sophmore at Elizabethtown Area High School and president of the Lower Dauphin County 4-H Baby Beef Club, said she will save the money.

The reserve grand champion junior steer, shown by John Holloway of West Chester, Chester County, was sold to Danny George of George's Foodliner Market in Bethlehem for \$1.80 a pound, or a total of \$2,448.




