

Warwick adult ed. slates pesticide class


LITITZ, Pa. - The adult education program of Warwick High School will be offering a 10-week course beginning March 1 on the application and licensing of pesticides. Thomas Arehart, vocational agriculture instructor, will teach the classes to be held in the high school ag shop from 7 to 9 p.m. Upon completion of the course, certified pesticide applicators licenses will be issued.

Registration fee is \$11.


Anyone wishing to take part in the course should contact David Hilbert, Warwick adult education director, by phone at the Warwick Middle School, and remit a check for \$11 to the same by mail. Registration deadline is February 22. Twelve people must enroll in order for the course to be offered. In case of cancellation, all checks will be refunded.


Hilbert will also be in the lobby of the Warwick High School on Thursday, February 17, from 7:30 - 8:30 p.m. for those who would like to register at this time.

program was toured over 100 times in 1976, alone.

She originated the idea of a peach blossom festival and Peachilicious Weekend which have brought thousands of non-farmers out into the orchards.

Sensing a need for a peach industry cookbook, she almost singlehandedly compiled a 200-page "Passion for Peaches Cookbook" which has become a best seller at the Maple Lawn Farm Market.

Paul McPherson is president of the National Peach Council, and as the first lady of the industry, Mrs. McPherson has helped to organize NPC activities.

She coordinated the women's promotional education seminar during the NPC convention in Hershey last March and has helped re-structure the organization's finance committee.

Her talents for creativity led her to name the recently formed national coalition of farm women commodity promotion group, which was christened American Agri-Women.

Gail now serves on their goal setting committee and was a speaker at the AAW's first national convention in Kansas City last November.


She has now begun touring her lively, informative speech, "The Case for the Professional Farm Wife," as a result of media reprints of the speech. Mrs. McPherson spoke in January to the Nebraska Ag Progress convention in Lincoln.

She is currently coordinating a national ag day display planned for the York Mall on March 18 and 19. The educational display is a project of the women's committee of the York County Farmer's Association.

Tuesday, she will speak in Gettysburg at the Pennsylvania Roadside Marketing Conference on the variety of marketing techniques which have been successful at Maple Lawn Farms.

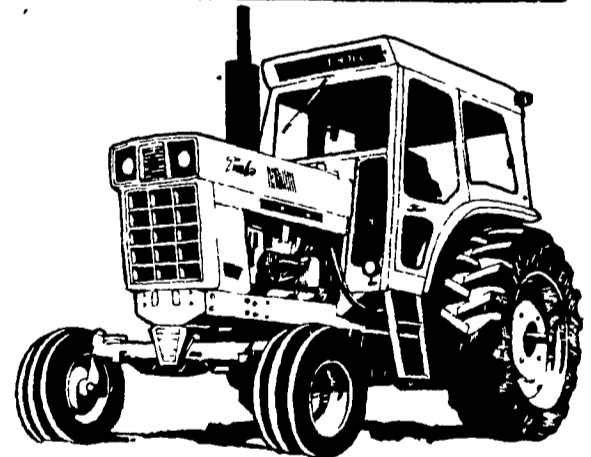

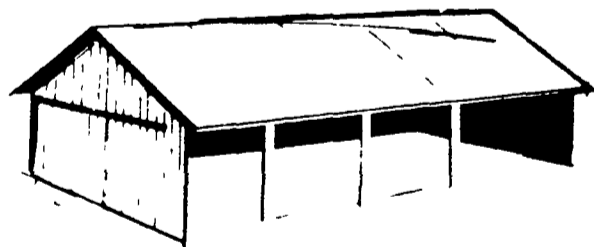
