Weekly 51 - Cattle - Compared with the previous weeks close -

Closing prices on Slaughter Steers and Heifers were steady to 25 cents higher. Cows were mostly steady, and bulls 1.00-2.00 higher. Four day receipts 14,300 as compared 12,300 previous week and 17,100 a year ago. As has been the case the past several weeks, the fed cattle trade followed a rather uneven pattern during the trading period. Prices were forced downward on the opening session, but fully recovered the decline on later days. However, late demand was generally dull as carcass prices again weakened, and there was an overall air of caution engulfing the live

trade during the week, with most interests competing for immediate requirements. Much of the Steer and Heifer supply was good to average choice and included several loads Choice and Prime 4-5 1350-1600 lb. Steers. Steers made up approximately 39 of the weeks total and Heifers 33. Cows comprised 15 and Feeders 10.
