Over the past several weeks, the trade has generally been lacking in any continued aggressiveness and at times on a hand-to-mouth basis. Despite the moderate day-to-day price variations, the past five week period has registered a net change of only 25-50 upward. A large share of the Steer and Heifer supply for the period was of Good to Average-Choice grade. Steers made up approximately 40 of the week's total and heifers 37. Cows comprised 13 and Feeders 6.
