The plan, already under fire from several members of Congress, proposes to use mutual funds to buy working row crop farms and operate them under a system of leases and sharecropping agreements. It has been described as a new investment vehicle to be marketed to trustees of pension funds and other taxexempt institutions.

The Internal Revenue Service has been asked to rule on the tax-free status of the operation. In his letter to

Congressmen, Snyder asked: "If this type of farming operation is tax exempt, should not the same exemption be extended to every farmer in the nation?"

John W. Scott, master of the National Grange, has called for Congressional investigative hearings on the plan.

"This raid on productive griculture land is agriculture stopped," Scott said. "The long range effects could be devastating to both our family farm system and thousands of small




