

#### CFTC seeks comments

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The **Commodity Futures Trading** Commission is requesting comment on revisions of the definition of "bona fide hedging transactions or positions" and the requirements for classifying positions as bona fide hedging.

Comment also is sought on a proposed new regulation dealing with requirements for classifying "certain other positions" as bona fide hedging.
The Commission seeks

"substantive" public views on the proposed amendments.

A major change from the current definition deals with cross hedges and anticipatory hedges. 


