Plans are being for-

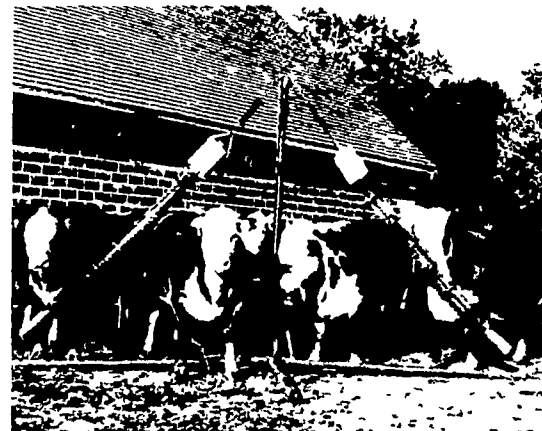
mulated for an upcoming trip to the York Day Nursery, where the Society will be presenting gift cot quilts they are making as a group service project.
