with the words "I'm a little shook up." A voice from the crowd shouted: "We're shook up too, Harry!" and the Agricultural Extension Service. On Thurshook up too, Harry!"

Reno Thomas, minority spokesman on the House Ag Committee, said the case they were viewing was a "classic example of the kind of farm condemnation H.B. 111 would help prevent." Then he warned: "All we need to do is keep taking the best land away from food production and 'Mrs. Housewife' won't like the prices she'll have to pay."

Petitions were made available for signatures, and are probably still open if anyone wishes to place his name on them. One such petition was passed around at the District 5 meting of Inter-State Milk Producers on Thursday afternoon.

Before the rally was over, it was emphasized that the Refuse Authority already owns the 58 acres in question by virtue of the Declaration of Taking they filed earlier. Therefore the battle is far from over. Attorney Heinley said, "Now we have to cisenfranchise them (LARA)."

State Representative Noah Wenger, ended his comments with "We have been paying lip service to conservation of farmland for years, we're going to have to do more than that."

Among the other groups which are actively giving support to the Barleys are the State Grange, the Pennsylvania Farmers Association, the Pennsylvania Farmers Union, the Soil Conservation Service

and the Agricultural Extension Service. On Thursday night, at a meeting on the Millersville State College campus, the Conestoga Valley Association also came out in favor of finding alternatives to the Creswell landfill. A resolution was passed by the CVA to try and save the Barley farm through a combination of legislative action, re-cycling and the use of Lachester Landfill on the Lancaster-Chester county line near Honey Brook.

The CVA joined legislators and other groups in encouraging that opponents to LARA's plans attend a LARA meeting this coming Tuesday afternoon; attend the March 23 meeting of the Manor Township supervisors, and visit LARA members personally.


## Women Earn
