

Jefferson Yoder, the 1976 DHIA champ, reaffirmed his position as a strong contender for the 1977 crown, by having three of his 60 cows complete lactations last month which exceeded 1000 pounds of butterfat. Leading the trio was Number 39, with a record of 24,309 pounds of milk, a 4.3 per cent test, and 1037 pounds of butterfat. Number 35 placed second with 1012 pounds of butterfat, while Number 1 checked in third for butterfat (1005 pounds) and first in milk production (26,421 pounds). All lactations were completed in 305 days.

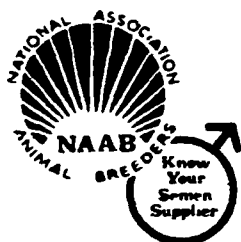
