

DO YOU HAVE A BIG BUG PROBLEM? AND BUNKER COTTON? COME ON IN!

Flea beetles. They leave scratch marks on leaves. Enough of 'em can kill young corn.

European corn borers. First generation feeds on leaves. Later ones bore into stalk, ear and shank.

Southwestern corn borers. They feed in whorls, damage stalks.

Fall armyworms. They chomp in the whorls and on the leaves.

True armyworms. They feed in the whorls and on the lower leaves.

Nematodes. Many species attack roots. Most common are lance, stubby root and root knot.

Corn rootworms. They eat crown, the blade roots, even the stalk. Adults attack silk.
