> The Royster terminal is now under construction by Tidewater Construction Corporation of Norfolk and is scheduled for completion in late 1977. It will be available to the public for storage and transshipment of ammonia. The new complex will have a storage capacity of 35,000 metric tons, will be able to unload vessels at the rate of 1,250 tons per hour and outload at the rate of 100 tons per hour. The annual throughput will be 300,000
