## Key issues discussed by York PFA members

YORK, Pa. - The York County Farmers' Association held their first annual Spring meeting on March 31 at Avalong farms, with about 70 members attending.

State President Eugene Thompson was the guest speaker for the evening dinner meeting. He briefed the York County mem-

bership on the insurance problems which have arisen within the state coverage area. In order to assure continued service to the membership, PFA is in the process of establishing a brokerage agency. Area meetings were being scheduled to explain the changeover to county delegates.

Thompson urged in-

dividual member involvement in policy setting issues within PFA, especially in the key areas of legislation. Farmers were encouraged to seek elective offices at local levels, as well as become involved in contacting their area officials about upcoming farm-related issues.

"We have more personal freedom in all the world than anyone else," reminded Thompson. "And we don't want to lose it."

National legislative chairman for the county, Lou Wambaugh, Delta, reported on the recent tour to meet with Pennsylvania representatives in Washington. During a visit

with Congressman William Goodling on March 10 and 11, the key issues of Common Situs picketing and minimum wage legislation were discussed.

Charles Rauhauser, Dover, was a member of the delegation on March 28 to the State Capitol for PFA's legislative tour. Pending farm-related legislation includes bills on land use, machinery right-of-way, and marketing and bargaining legislation.

Additional field research activities will cover all additional major corn, soybean and sorghum producing states.

Troyer's research interests are centered on breeding methods, selection for earliness and disease resistance.
