Ready to cook movement very slow except where prior committed. Slaughter schedules fairly heavy at some plants while light at others. Today's LTL asking prices ranged 1-2 cents lower on both plant and US Grade A. Advance interest slow in developing. Live supplies ample to more desirable weights than earlier in the week. Undertone weak and unsettled. Current broiler-fryer negotiated prices for immediate includes mostly multiple-drop shipments to New York City from Delmarva.
