Seed potato testing available

HARRISBÛRG - Pa. Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture Kent Shelhamer has announced that beginning immediately the Department's Bureau of Foods and Chemistry will, upon request, sample and test seed potatoes for viability. This is a new service being offered by the Department of Agriculture.

Shelhammer said that the service is being provided to help potato growers eliminate a problem that arose last season.

"Several shipments of seed stock received by our growers were suspected of having been subjected to chemical sprout inhibitor treatment. The fields planted with these seed potatoes showed a very unsatisfactory plant population," Shelhammer explained.

Chemical sprout inhibitors

maintain weight and prevent sprouting.

"With the high cost of production today," Shelhammer said, Divison of Fruits and "our growers cannot afford to invest their money on seed that has no chance of producing a good crop. Hopefully, this service will help assure good yields from potato plantings.

Growers and dealers can do much on their own to determine the viability of seed potatoes when recieved, Shelhamer added. If the tubers exhibit no signs of sprouting, a sample should be taken from the lot and placed under conditions which normally would encourage sprouting. If the tubers fail to sprout, the Department of Agriculture should be contacted.

Shelhammer said that

are sometimes used on anyone desiring to have potatoes for store sales to their seed stock sampled should write the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Chemistry, Foods and Vegetables, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, Pa 17120, or call 717-787-5108, or any of the Department's seven field offices.

As soon as an application is received, an agent from the Department will call on the grower or dealer and take a sampling of about six tubers. The selected sample will then be analyzed in the Department's Harrisburg laboratory. Reports of the findings will be issued to the applicant on completion of the tests.

Charges for this service are \$16 per lot plus mileage for sampling at 15 cents per mile.
