Enterotoxemia takes toll of lambs

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. — Enterotoxemia, or overeating disease, takes a toll of the best lambs in many sheep flocks, says specialists at Penn State University.

Good lambs getting plenty of milk from their dams or being fed grain from a creep may suddenly die without showing symptoms. When lambs do show symptoms of enterotoxemia, they are depressed and wobbly-gaited.

Little can be done for treatment. The best precaution is vaccination,

according to researcher. Ewes can be vaccinated against the disease in late pregnancy. This protects lambs as long as they are nursing. Lambs over one month old should be vaccinated.

Vaccination against enterotoxemia is easy and economical insurance against this expensive sheep disease.
