



Lebanon DHIA MONTHLY REPORT

MARCH 1977

The two top cows in Lebanon County's DHIA for last month traded first and second places for milk and butterfat production. Abram Lefever's "Becky" won the butterfat race with her lactation totals of 23,273 pounds of milk, a 3.6 per cent test and 842 pounds of butterfat. She placed second in milk, Ralph Shirk and Sons' "Star" placed first in milk and second in butterfat with the following compilations: 23,514 pounds of milk, a 3.5 per cent test, and 833 pounds of butterfat.
