-The swine to be moved must not have been few raw garbage for at least 45 days before the date of shipment;

-All hogs on the farm must be tested and examined to make sure they are free of hog cholera and other communicable diseases of

-All swine on the farm must be inspected within 24 hours before moving the slaughter animals;

-The animals sent to slaughter must be individually identified with eartags or a red color mark or moved in USDA sealed vehicles, and must be accompanied by an inspection certificate issued by a state or federal animal health official or by an accredited veterinarian.

Written comments on the proposed amendment should be sent to the Deputy Administrator, Veterinary Services, APHIS, USDA, Room 714, Hyattsville, Md. 20782. The 60-day period for comments will expire on June 24, 1977.
