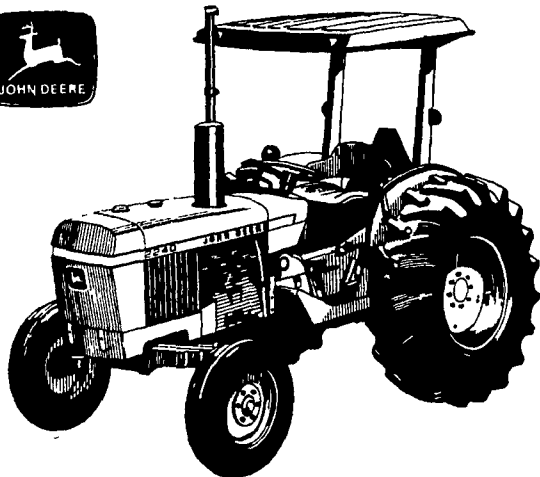
Seven students representing six chapters competed in the public

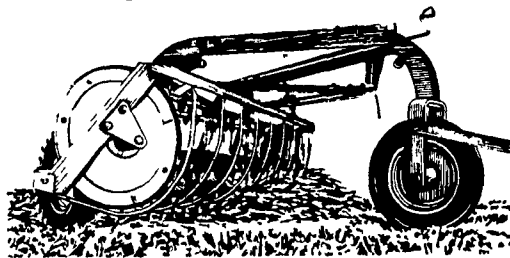

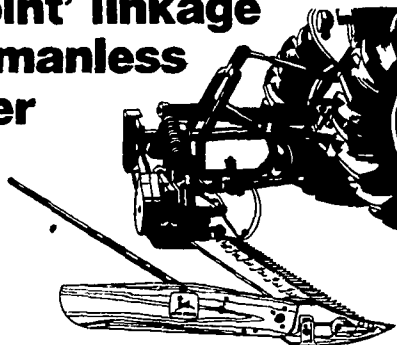

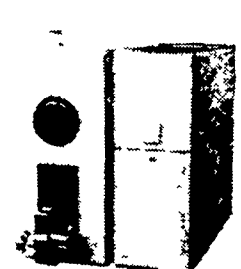
