## Sprayer calibration includes uniform setting of nozzles

FLEMINGTON, N.J. - amount sprayer, there's an important consideration which is often overlooked, according to Hunterdon County Extension Agent William G. McIntyre.

Calibrating a sprayer is not complicated. It's a case of laying out an acre or portion thereof, and seeing how much material is used to cover that particular area at the speed it will be run, pressure, etc. of the particular component. Often overlooked is the uniformity of the nozzle output on the spray boom. Check the

When calibrating the ap- delivered by each individual plication rates of a field nozzle on the boom, to be sure that all nozzles are delivering the same amount of material.

> In the case of herbicides, undertreating in an area could result in weed problems and overtreating could result in crop losses. Aluminum, brass, and plastic nozzles wear out. Stainless steel, while it costs possibly three times as much as the less expensive aluminum, brass, or plastic ones, will last three and one half times as long. Hardened stainless steel on the other hand, probably the most expensive of nozzles, costing about 3.6 times as much as the softer materials will last ten to fifteen times as long. So this season, before you use the sprayer, calibrate it and check the nozzles. Replace those that are worn, that are not delivering the proper amount, and be sure that the delivery along the boom is uniform, says McIntyre.

**Storing Winter Clothes** -When preparing clothes for storage, give some attention to the hangers used. Mrs. Ruth Ann Wilson, Extension clothing and textiles specialist Penn State University, suggests using shaped wooden hangers for coats and suit jackets. Padded hangers are good choices for lighter weight garments, but make sure the padding is smooth so it will help retain the shape of the garment. Also be sure garments are clean before storing them. Wash and wear and permanent press finishes tend to hold soil and

stains. Unless these are removed, they will "set" during storage and be difficult, if not impossible, to remove later. **TRY A**


