SOUTHAMPTON, Pa. -Area dairy farmers who are members of Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative received \$9.88 per hun-dredweight for milk they produced during April.

The April weighted average blend price is equivalent to 21 cents per quart and compares to \$9.89 per hundredweight for the previous month and \$10.00 per hundredweight for a year ago. Quart equivalent prices were 21 cents for the previous month and 22 cents for a year ago.

The farm base milk price for April was \$10.06 per hundredweight while the excess price was \$8.52 per hundredweight. The but-terfat differential was 11.5 cents for each point above or below 3.5 per cent. The base price is down two cents per hundredweight from the previous month and down 18 cents per hundredweight from a year ago. The excess price is up 25 cents per hundredweight from a year ago. A total of 484 million pounds of Federal Order 4 producer milk was pooled in April of which 56 per cent was sold as Class I, compared to 60 per cent for the previous month and 61 per cent a year ago. A total of 8,060 Order No. 4 producers provided 16.1 million pounds per day to dealers during April averaging 2,003 pounds per farm day. Total value of producer milk was set at \$48 million for the month.

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

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
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
