## Rest stops encouraged

HARRISBURG -- The Pennsylvania State Councils of REACT in conjunction with the Pennsylvania Motor Truck Association will operate "Safety Break" stations for weary holiday travelers on Memorial Day weekend as part of the National REACT Safety Break effort against highway accidents, sponsored by the American Trucking Associations, Inc., Washington, D.C.

"More than 47,100 people died on our nation's highways in 1976," said James E. Bear, President, Pa. Council REACT, Lancaster, Pa. "Many of these fatalities are attributable to sleepiness,

fatigue, and 'highway hypnosis.' Our aim is to get travelers off the highway long enough to wake them up with a coffee break."

The REACT Safety Breaks will be located at more than a dozen specified rest stop locations throughout the state. They will operate from 6:00 P.M., Friday, May 27, through 6:00 P.M., Monday, Memorial Day, May 30.
