Farmers needing strong need for on-farm experience not available on the campus, according to Leon J. Johnson of the Department of Agronomy, Johnson said the urban students realize that formal course work becomes more meaningful with some partime farm employment.

Johnson is gathering the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of farmers interested in hiring students for the summer or for somewhat longer periods. His address is 13 Tyson Building, University Park, Pa. 16802. The telephone number if 814 865-1147.

"Here is an excellent opportunity for farmers, who need temporary help, to participate in educating people who will be serving farmers in the future," he stated.

A survey made at Penn State in 1973 revealed a changing trend in the geographical origins of undergraduate students in agriculture. By 1973, twothirds of the students were from urban and suburban backgrounds, instead of the traditional rural areas.

While 63 per cent of the upperclass students in 1973 were from urban areas, over 70 per cent of the incoming freshmen were from nonrural homes. The survey indicated that further changes could be expected in this direction.

Undergraduate enrollment in the College of Agriculture rose 184 per cent from 1970 to 1976. This past college term were there undergraduates and 440 graduate students, making Penn State's agricultural enrollment the fifth largest in the nation.

He is estimated to have a female descendant in one of every three dairy herds in the U.S. These cows produce more than 600 million quarts of milk in one year, enough to supply every American with three glasses of milk a day for a full year.
