Compared with the previous week's close: Slaughter Steers and Heifers 2-75 lower. Cows steady to 1-0 lower, bulls firm, instances 50 higher.

Four day receipts 20,900 as compared 16,400 previous week and 16,200 a year ago.

The fed cattle trade was forced downward on Monday and Tuesday under the combined influence of liberal Marketings and lowered carcass realizations. Demand was generally good during the period; however, and part of the early downturn was regained on a modest mid-week run. Pressure to move market-ready cattle was further increased by 100 degree weekend temperatures accompanied by high humidity the overall

finish of the steer supply was attractive with a liberal percentage choice although many were mixed 3-4 yield grade.

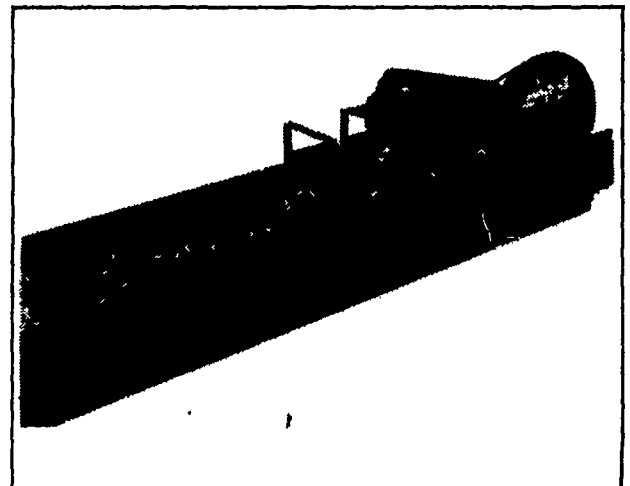

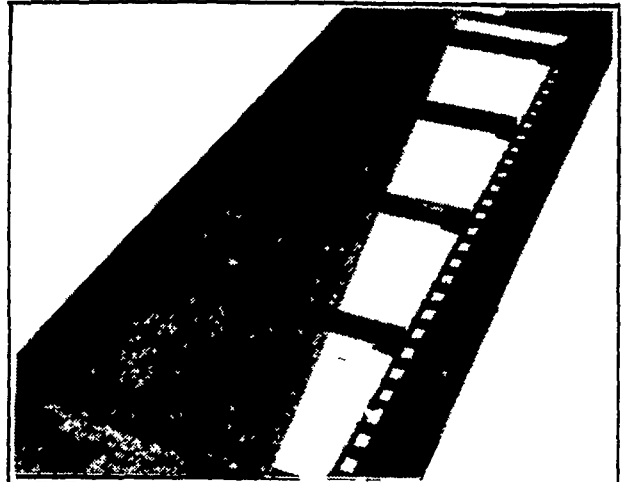

TAPER BOARD BUNK FEEDERS and DOUBLE CHAIN CONVEYORS

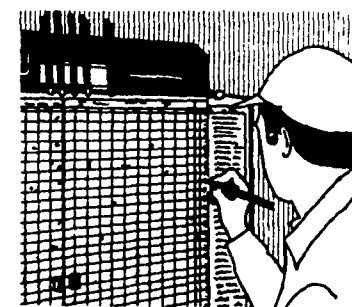

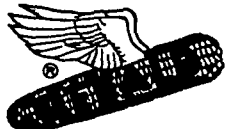
