The Dauphin County Society of Farm Women Group 1 held their June meeting at the home of Dolly Pickel. Co-hostess for the evening was Joann Pickel.

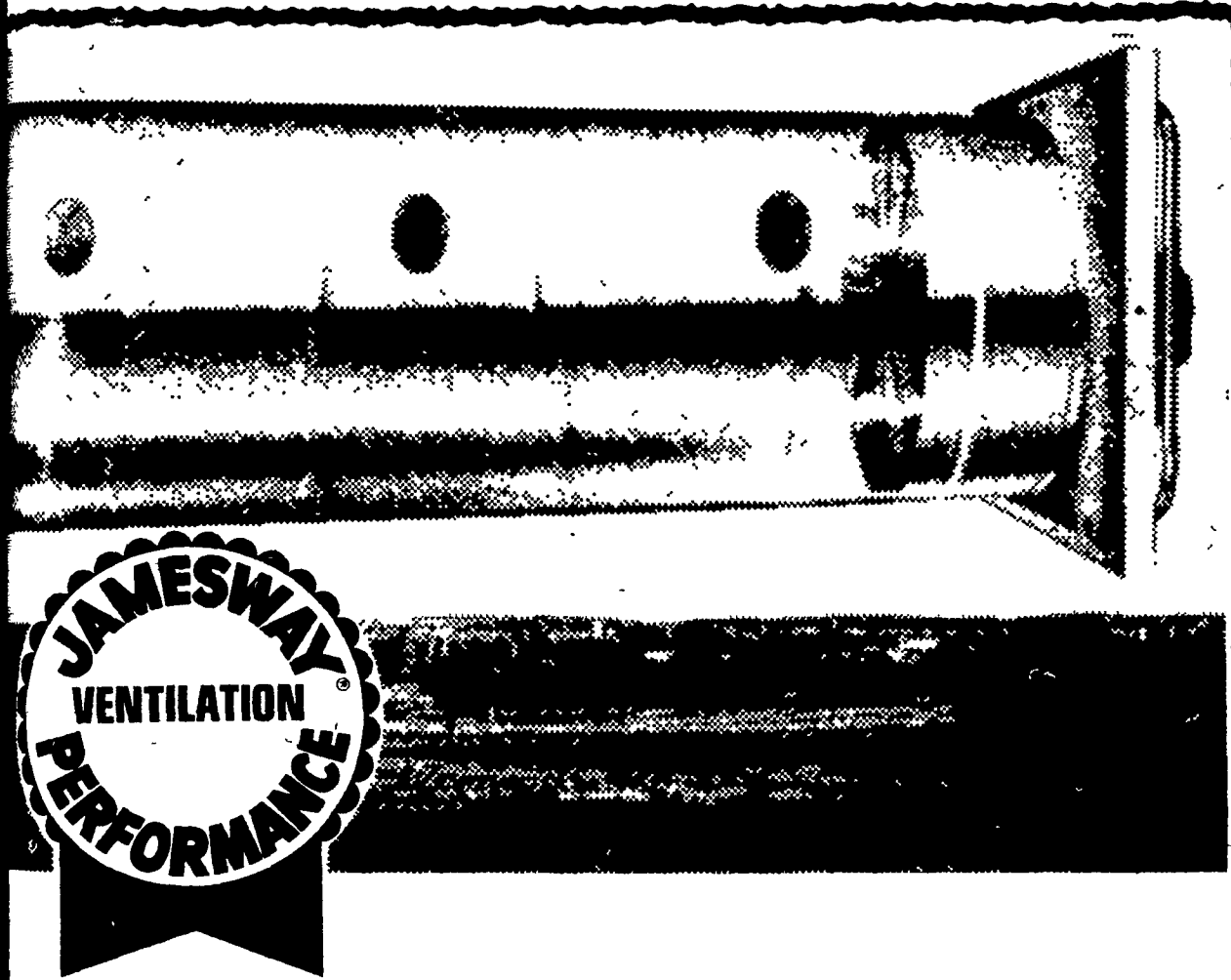
