## U.S. called dependable source

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The performance of the United States over the years has demonstrated that it is the world's most dependable supplier of farm commodities in the quantities, kinds, and grades desired. We feel that responsibility. We recognize that any failure on our part — or any fear on the part of our customers — is the more serious for the very many reasons that we are the standard of dependability in the world, said USDA Secretary Bob Bergland recently while touring Japan.

“President Carter, and others in his administration including his secretary of agriculture, have assured our customer nations repeatedly that there will be no embargo on soybeans despite the reduced carryover this year. We have assured our customers that we would never consider an embargo on any of our commodities our customers depend on from us — barring some unforeseen action by

an unfriendly nation waging actual economic warfare. At the same time, as a dependable supplier, we must also have dependable customers.

“Being a dependable supplier does of course require more than good intentions. It requires the capacity to produce — and an agricultural system that operates efficiently. In the United States, we recognize that we have been unusually blessed with the natural resources that include large contiguous areas well watered, with rich soil, within the temperate zone. But it is just as true that we have in the United States a tremendous production and marketing system — based on able and well educated farmers, good transportation systems, and a hundred years of building institutions for research, marketing, price reporting, grading, handling, quality control, and other services.

“American agriculture is built primarily on a system of family farmers who make

their own production decisions based on their resources, abilities, and desires. Our marketing system is also diversified, privately operated, and highly competitive — a system that has made it possible for the United States to be flexible and responsive in meeting export demand.

“In recent years, the United States has provided around half of all the grain moving in world trade. This grain has been provided in a wide variety of kinds, grades, moisture, and protein content — whatever

the customer desired. Such problems as have occurred in past years with quality — and with failure to deliver at specification — have represented a small percentage of our export trade. On the whole, American agriculture is the most productive in the history of the world since Jacob sent his sons into Egypt to look for corn. It has provided for the world — from an abundance of high quality production in a time when no other supplying country could have come close to doing the job.”

## Brucellosis tackled

NEW YORK, N.Y. — The need for additional research and greater flexibility on certain technical aspects of brucellosis eradication was discussed at a recent meeting in Washington, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced.

Discussion centered upon possible improvements or innovations in specific areas of technology such as:

diagnostic procedures, vaccination methods and procedures; areas of research needs; handling of infected birds; indemnity procedures; and surveillance techniques.

The need for better communication with producers about how brucellosis is spread and the steps involved in eradication was also noted.
