THE BUCK - Four out of seven class winners registered full pulls at the Buck Tractor Pulls last Saturday, and they were the only ones to go the entire distance of 300 feet during the competition.

In the 9000 pound open class, John Ferry of Westport, Mass., steered his Packard V-12 powered rig all the way through the finish line. David Becker of Mount Joy placed second with a pull of 290 feet and nine inches from his machine, powered by twin 460-cubic inch Ford engines. Close behind him was Tom Dedgar of Freeland, Md. on an IH 856 with pull of 288 feet and eight inches.

Tom Middleton of Ridgely, Md., swept to victory with a full pull in the 9000 pound super stock class. Bedgar placed second with a pull of 286-5. New Holland's Tony Stauffer came in third with a pull of 254-2 from his Deutz 9006.

In the 7000 pound modified class, Les Houck of Kinzer went the equivalent of a touchdown aboard his Cockshutt, powered by twin 440 cubic inch Dodge engines. Close behind was Dave Becker with a pull of 292-3. John Ferry placed third with a pull of 288-10.

The fourth man to go the full distance was Tony Stauffer, aborad his Deutz 9006 in the 7000 pound super stock class. Marlin Brubaker

trailed him with his AC D21 to capture second place at 289-11. Tim Stauffer, riding an 8006 Deutz, finished third at 285-9.

In the 12,000 pound super stock class, Bedgar finished first with a pull of 276-2 from his IH 856. Middleton placed second at 284-2, and Harry Griest from Coatesville squeezed out a pull of 220-5 from his IH 1456.

Less than two feet separated the winner and runner-up in the 5000 pound modified class. A pull of 252-7 won the class for Gary Mills

of Fallston, Md., while a second machine, owned by the same man, incidentally, went for a distance of 250-10. Dave Johnson, Deerfield, N.J. placed third with a pull of 224-11 from his Chevy-powered rig.

Tim Stauffer won the 5000 pound super stock class with his Deutz 8006, going for a distance of 277-2. Coleman Wheatley, Bethel, Del., was second, driving a JD 4010 for a distance of 249-1. Placing third was Dale Smoker of Cochranville aboard an AC 180. His pull measured 242-5.
