compared 13,200 previous
week and 14,100 a year ago.
For the first time in four
weeks, closing prices on
slaughter steers and heifers
were lower than at the end of
the previous period. In addi-
tion to the bearish effects
of a lower carcass trade
early, marketings were
poorly distributed over the
trading period with more
than 50 per cent of the four
day supply arriving on
Monday. There was a fair
percentage of choice steers
included in the run, but also
an increasing volume of
Good and low-Choice 975-1050
lb. new crop steers and 800-
900 lb. heifers. There was
some mild early feeder
inquiry for partly fattened
steers suitable for a short
turn in the feedlot. Much of
the heifer supply was good to
average-choice. Slaughter
steers made up ap-
proximately 48 per cent and
heifers 29 per cent, cows
comprised 14 per cent and
feeders 6 per cent.

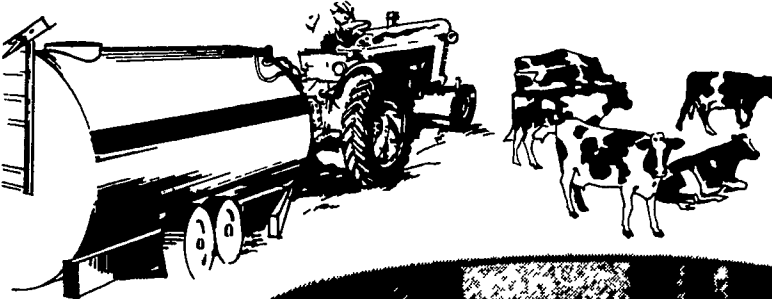

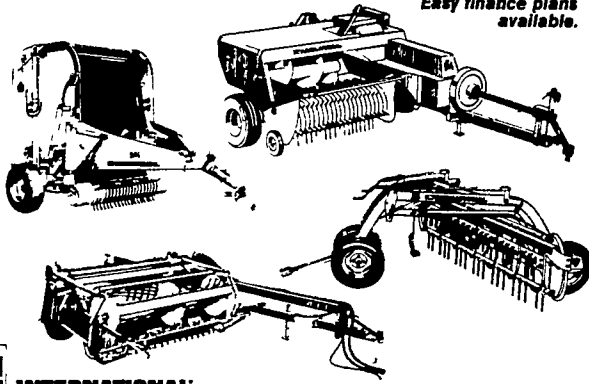
