Further, Congress ordered that henceforth one star would be added to the flag on the admission of each new state

Farmers Spend

US farmers spent \$81.8 billion for production goods and services in 1975. This was four per cent less than a year earlier. Average expenditures per farm amounted to \$29,172. The biggest outlay went for feed—about 15 per cent. Other leading expenditures included such items as seeds and plants. fertilizer, lime and soil conditioners, and agricultural chemicals.


