Out of a field of 16 in the senior division, eight girls were chosen to go onto regionals. Those girls were: Amy Balsbaugh, Myerstown; Wendy Bowman, Palmyra; Dorothy Bemesderfer, Lebanon: Nancy Hadley, Palmyra; Holly Kneasel, Lebanon; Rosella Krall, Lebanon; Lenore Kreiser, Annville; and Lisa Yordy, Campbelltown.

Amy Balsbaugh is a 15year-old member of the Myerstown 4-H raiders, in which she has been a member for six years.
