

# Region sends four to state 4-H dress revue

CAMP HILL, Pa. - Seven out of 80 young women participating in the Capital Regional 4-H dress revue emerged victorious on July 21 when they were awarded gold ribbons, the highest honor attainable at the fashion competition. Four of the seven will now have the change to participate in the state dress revue on August 2 at Eisenhower Auditorium on the Penn State University campus.

Laurel Ort created several coordinating outfits in baby blue. Among her ensemble was a polyester raincoat, an A-line skirt with a front kick pleat, a polyester crepe silk print blouse utilizing maize as an accenting color, solid knit pants, and a coordinating striped knit jacket.

LANCASTER, Pa. - The July meeting of the Lancaster 4-H County Council was held July 20, at the Lancaster County Farm and

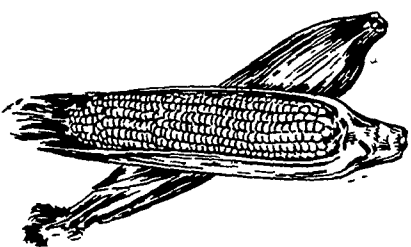
Home Center, Lancaster, Pa.

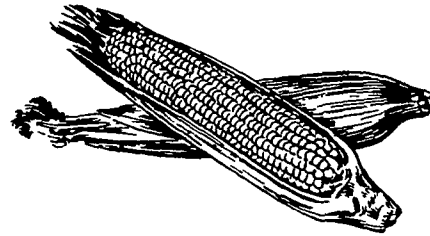
A day camp will be held July 26 at the Lancaster County Park starting at 9:30 a.m. Crafts, recreation, and nature ideas will be presented in the program.

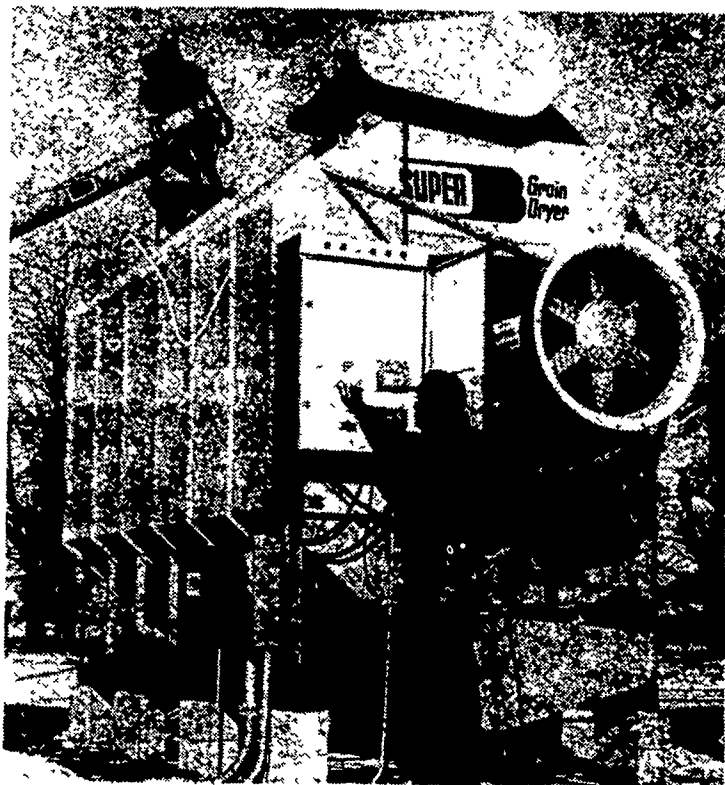

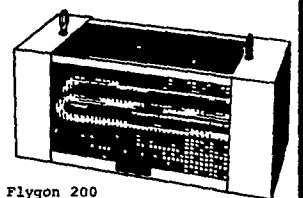
