There will be a club picnic on August 16 at the Elizabethtown Community Park, 6 p.m. Members are asked to bring covered dishes.

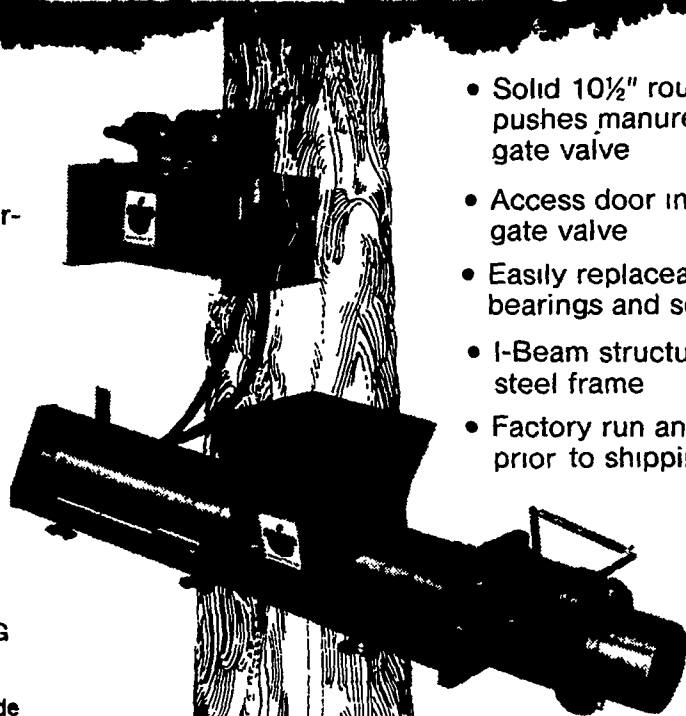
Members are reminded that the pig roundup will be August 8 and 9 at the Lancaster Stockyards, Lancaster, Pa.
