Eggs counted

HARRISBURG, Pa. Pennsylvania layers produced 256 million eggs during June 1977, down three per cent from the previous month but one per cent above a year earlier according to the Crop Reporting Service. The June average of 12.4 million layers was one per cent below a year earlier. Egg production per 100 layers during June totaled 2,058

eggs, compared with 2,001 a year ago.

The nation's laying flocks produced 5.2 billion eggs during June 1977, down five per cent from the previous month and two per cent below a year ago. The number of layers during June averaged 267.1 million, compared with 270.1 million a year earlier. Egg production per 100 layers was one per cent below June 1976.
