DES MOINES, Iowa-A new dimension has been added to emergency parts ordering service for Massey-Ferguson customers. It will enable MF dealers to determine availability and shipping status instantly for critically needed parts. The new system is called

E-COM. It provides direct priority to special parts situations, "emergency" communication between the needed by farmer and "unit down." For "unit communication between the Massey-Ferguson dealer and the central parts operation computer for parts termed "emergency" or "unit down." When a dealer uses E-COM, the standard parts ordering procedures are bypassed, thus giving top

The terminal has 65 keys on the keyboard which are used to order parts and select methods of shipment. The computer answers by voice.

More than 147,000 parts can be ordered instantly by E-COM. In addition, a dealer obtains complete substitution and cancellation information automatically on parts which are no longer supplied.

E-COM is designed to respond to two kinds of parts and delivery.

down" orders, the highest priority, the comptuer located in Racine, will provide shipping information as to type of carrier, carrier code, dated shipped, number of packages, weight, bill of lading number, air bill number, and flight number (if available). This permits the dealer to initiate tracing procedures from his end to expedite the shipment. Parts are shipped from the closest regional parts service center with stock.

Massey-Ferguson explained that E-COM offers a new dimension in service for "Emergency" part orders. The existing fast system for ordering routine parts will continue to be used. But when "emergency" or "unit down" parts are needed and are not available at the dealership, E-COM can greatly speed up ordering
