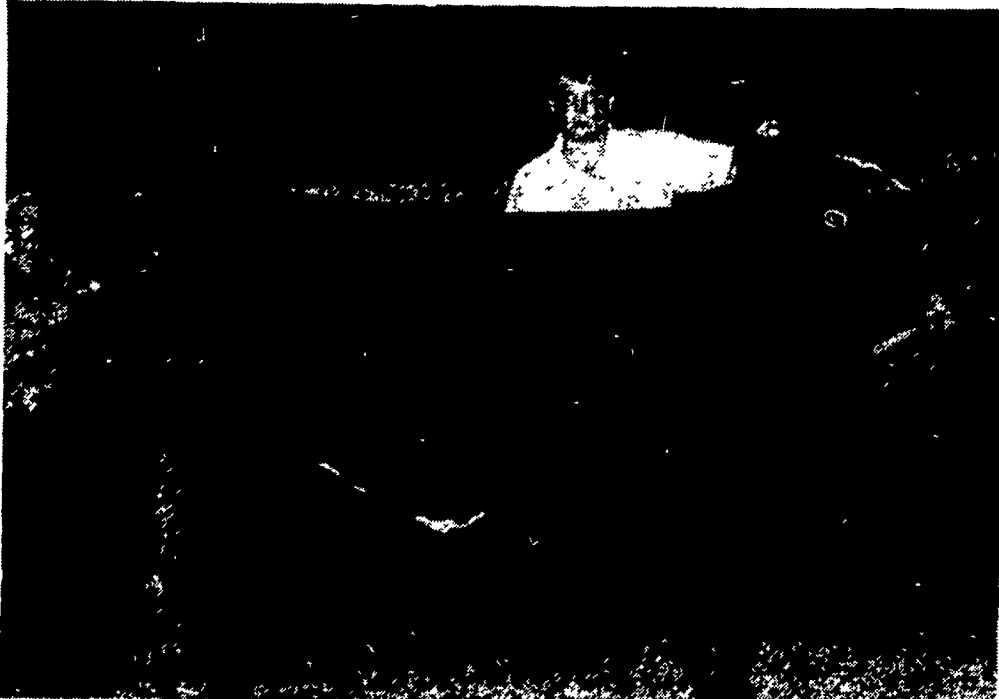

The Chester County Holstein Breeders Annual Black and White District

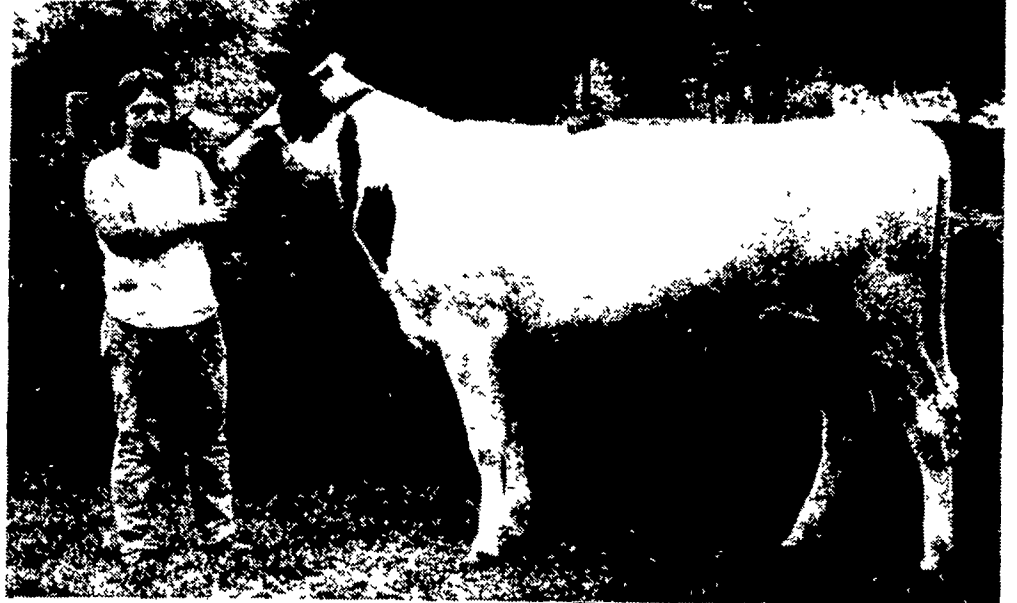
