

# Hershey attends conference

COCHRANVILLE, Pa. - America Chapter of Ocuatorara Hershey of the Cochranville High School recently attended a National FFA

Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C. The week-long conference was held at the National FFA Center near the nation's capitol.

The FFA conference program is designed to improve leadership skills, develop an understanding of the national heritage, and prepare FFA members for more effective leadership roles in their chapter and community. The conference is also a forum for the exchange of FFA chapter activity ideas among members from across the nation.

Besides the training sessions, the 1977 program includes visits to Mount Vernon Plantation, the National Archives, Smithsonian Institution, Arlington National Cemetery, and several other historic monuments and memorials in and around the Capitol.

A highlight of the conference was a Thursday morning visit to the office of Congressman Dick Schulze of Malvern, Pa. Later participants attended a capitol hill luncheon featuring a question and answer period with congressmen and Washington leaders in business and industry.
